Full schedule ahead for Comanche Trace

The 2006 UT-San Antonio Roadrunner Invitational was just the beginning for the Club at Comanche Trace.

Following the Roadrunner Invitational, which concluded Tuesday, the club will host the Southland Conference golf tournament in April as well.

“If you have this fine of a golf course, you want to test it with the best,” said Comanche Trace head golf professional Blake Bingham. “We’re very fortunate to have hosted the Roadrunner Invitational, and look forward to hosting other great tournaments in the future.”

Bingham said the Roadrunner Invitational was not only a success for the UTSA men’s golf program and for Comanche Trace, but also the city of Kerrville.

“Kerrville will benefit greatly on the money spent at the local businesses,” Bingham said. “The teams stayed at the Inn of the Hills and ate at the restaurants in town. It was a win-win situation for everyone involved.”

UTSA coach Chris Donielson enjoyed the facilities at Comanche Trace so much that he plans on having future Roadrunner Invitationals at the club.

“Comanche Trace has a great golf course and a fantastic, friendly staff,” said Donielson. “We hope the future tournaments get bigger and better each year.”

There will be other tournaments in between the Roadrunner Invitational and the Southland Conference Tournament for Comanche Trace, such as the Hill Country Classic Nov. 10-12. According to Bingham, the Hill Country Classic could field as many as 300 players.

“That’s (Hill Country Classic) always a big event, too,” Bingham said.

The Hill Country Classic is co-hosted by Comanche Trace, Riverhill Country Club and Scott Schreiner Municipal Golf Course. The tournament field is divided into thirds, and each day a set of thirds plays at a different course.

Southeastern Louisiana wins Roadrunner title

Southeastern Louisiana — with five scores of 74 or better — pulled away to win the UT-San Antonio Roadrunner Invitational team title Tuesday at The Club at Comanche Trace.

Southeastern finished with a 54-hole total of 846. Sam Houston was second with 855. St. John’s followed with 863. UTSA finished fourth with 866.

Southeastern’s Peter O’Keefe, Sam Houston’s Robert Gwin and St. John’s Keegan Bradley shared

medalist honors with an 8-under-par 208 total. UTSA's Thomas Kearney finished second with a 209 total.
